Introduction:	<p>European Garden Heritage Network (EGHN), Schloss Dyck Foundation and Paleis Het Loo have worked together to develop this program for the practical, on-site workshop.</p> <p>Orangeries can be considered as a kind of symbiosis between plants and garden architecture. Some plants would not be able to survive in our climate without the protection delivered by the orangeries and without the plants, orangeries would be meaningless and not even exist.</p> <p>This workshop will share knowledge of the care and maintenance of the plant stocks in orangeries, the preservation and development of the orangery buildings and related outdoor spaces and the practical horticultural expertise required.</p> <p>We encourage sustainable travel by train to the workshop and car shares where appropriate for the venues outside Apeldoorn (one hour from Amsterdam by train).</p>

Instructions for finding Stables 1 on Day 1:

Entrance : Green sliding door right from main entrance building (see schuifhekje 1, above).

If you come by car – main parking lot (google maps) – green sliding door slightly right from main entrance building.

If you come on foot: From statue ‘de Naald’ follow the ‘Koninklijke Park’ until you see a car park on your left hand side. Cross it towards the main parking lot. Go through the Green Sliding door before the main entrance building.
