



Programme for the workshop “Ponds and Fountains in Historic Gardens”	
Introduction:	<p>In this workshop, we want to outline the role of water bodies, fountains and water conduits in historic gardens, their preservation and maintenance and explore how changing water supply methods affect the restoration of fountains and ponds.</p> <p>Holland has been pre-eminent in water management for centuries and remains so to this day. Many other European gardens were influenced by Dutch designs that have water as a key element, but they have lost the skills to maintain and manage them. Others struggle in this period of climate change to cope with the wide fluctuations of water supply that we are all facing.</p>
